

General Disclosure for Programs Meeting Licensure or Certification Requirements

PROGRAM: Clinical Psychology, Psy.D.

As set out in the 1 November 2019 Final Rules in the Federal Register, the U.S. Department of Education requires that all institutions make public information regarding a program's ability to meet the licensure requirements for a particular state.

The programs customarily leading to licensure at Stevenson University have been designed to meet the licensure/certification requirements in Maryland as well as prepare students to apply for licensure exams in the State of Maryland. Students who intend to return or move to any state other than Maryland are advised to review the professional licensure disclosures pertaining to their program.

The chart below provides professional licensure disclosure information for the Stevenson University Doctor of Psychology in Clinical Psychology degree. Please note that states may also require candidates for licensure to complete

** Applicants for licensure in California must complete coursework/training in “human sexuality (10 contact hours); course in alcoholism/chemical dependency detection and treatment (1 semester/quarter); child abuse assessment (7 hours); spousal/partner abuse, detection and intervention strategies (15 contact hours); aging and long-term care (10 contact hours); suicide risk assessment and intervention (6 hours)” prior to licensure. These can be completed outside of the doctoral program.

*** Applicants for licensure in Michigan must complete training in human trafficking before applying for licensure, but this can be completed as a CE program or via scholarly article self-study rather than as part of a doctoral training program (for more information on this requirement, please see [MI Administrative Rule 338.2525](#)).

*** Applicants for licensure in Virginia will be required to hold a doctorate in clinical or counseling psychology from a professional psychology program in a regionally accredited university that was accredited at the time the applicant graduated from the program by the APA, CPA, or an accrediting body acceptable to the board beginning May 24, 2028; APA approval is not required prior to this date.
